Jubilee Committee Under Way

The Jubilee Committee started off the fraternal year early with a meeting on July 16 at the St Brigid's Parish Center. Attending the meeting was Grand Knight Yonel Verna, Chester Barkan, Deputy Grand Knight, Brothers Tom Oftring PGK, and Bruce Malito PGK.

Plans are well under way for the Jubilee celebration which will take place on Wednesday, September 21, 2005. The Westbury Manor has already be booked for this wonderful event which will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the council.

Several topics were discussed including the appointment of a journal editor, entertainment, fund raising during the upcoming fraternal year that will help offset the cost to the members, publicity, invitations to notables as well as several other issues. The members agreed to further our preparation for the celebration we would call upon the expertise of Brother James Carroll who chaired the very successful first annual Nassau Chapter Ball.

Beginning in the early part of 2004, letters "saving the Date" will be sent to all councils in New York State, and Supreme. Local politicians, religious leaders will also be invited. In addition, a keynote speaker will be selected.

In the coming fraternal year, it will be very important for members of our council to make a commitment. A commitment both to attend this event with their families and a commitment to get involved in the preparation. The council will be very involved with our communities, outreaches are being made to many of the diverse groups of our

MY BROTHER KNIGHTS, as we begin a new fraternal year, I am proud to say that during the 2002-03 fraternal year we have grown stronger. We have increased membership. We have increased our number of councils. We have increased the insurance protection we provide to our families. And we have increased the service and charitable contributions we provide to our Church and our communities.

And yet, with all that we have accomplished, we have only begun to approach our true potential. Since becoming supreme knight I have said repeatedly that we have a moral obligation to realistically offer to every eligible Catholic man the opportunity to join the Knights of Columbus. This spring I was privileged to present charters to two new councils in Chicago: St. Michael the Archangel, Patron of Police, Council 12173, and St. Florian, Patron of Firefighters, Council 12911. Also last year I traveled to Luke Air Force Base outside of Phoenix to present the charter to Father Vincent R. Capodanno Council 13024.

The enthusiasm of these new brother Knights — all police, fire and military personnel — is truly encouraging and makes clear that there are many opportunities to institute new councils composed of young and vigorous Catholic men. At the start of this fraternal year I ask you to commit to membership growth in the next six weeks, before the celebration of Knights of Columbus Family Week, Aug. 9-16. We must redouble our efforts to make sure there is a K of C presence in every parish and parish school. I encourage you to take extra steps in the coming year to include even more young men and women in our youth programs, especially our basketball free-throw contest, our citizenship essay contest and our drug abuse awareness and prevention program.

This past fraternal year may have been the greatest ever in the Order's history for our involvement with youth. We began with an unprecedented commitment to World Youth Day in Toronto. Many local and state jurisdictions participated in making this one of the most memorable meetings ever of young adults with Pope John Paul II. This past spring we also made an unprecedented commitment to the 2003 Special Olympics World Summer Games held last month in Ireland. Our \$1 million grant provided travel expenses for the teams from the United States, Canada and Mexico to compete in on the fourth Sunday of Easter. Most important, please continue your support for our Marian Hour of Prayer program and our rosary for peace effort, and our programs to promote adoration of the Blessed Sacrament......

Turning to our insurance program, I am sure you are as proud as I am of our general and field agents. They have achieved our best gains ever in life insurance and annuities sales. Their work provides needed protection and financial security for our families. It also provides the strong financial platform on which our fraternal programs rest.

Another source of pride is our record-breaking charitable giving. I want to thank every council that submitted its 2002 fraternal survey.
