Reflection of the Times: Advent and the Christmas Season

What a wonderful time. The holiday's are approaching; a time to reflect and pray about the birth of our savior.

However, what has happened in our society. With Halloween only a few days passed, the Christmas decorations are already going up. Retail stores are already pushing their holiday wares on all of us, through newspapers, television and countless other media. We are already being targeted by retailers with news of discounts and unbelievable sales on products. The rush is one. Christmas is only 40 shopping days away and the retailers have to make the profit. So it goes.

Its time to change this mindset. It is time to remember what Christmas is all about. Most people forget that before Christmas arrives a wonderful period known as Advent which beckons us to await the birth of our savior. What a wonderful thing to celebrate the birth of our lord, and the anticipation of that birth should fill us with more exuberance than any sale or discounted products.

Let's go back to that way of living. Let's forget the sales for a minute and let's adorn our homes with thoughts of the anticipated birth. Our culture tends to skip Advent and start celebrating Christmas after Thanksgiving—if we're lucky to make it that far! Then it's all packed up and stored away by New Year's. This year, consider returning to the ancient practice of seeing the whole Christmas "cycle"—the period that embraces both the Advent and Christmas seasons—as one unit of joyous celebration. Preparation comes first, then comes celebration extending a few weeks after Christmas Day.

The focal point of the Christmas cycle is obvious: God becoming one of us in Jesus, the Incarnation. All three phases of the cycle—Advent, Christmas and Epiphany—hinge on and celebrate that point. These celebrations help us to name the ways our lives are caught up in the "big story" of Christ. And these feasts tie our lives to Christians throughout history. The tradition of the Church, the living gospel, is the real-life experience of Christians like you and like me, and those who have gone before us.

During Advent, which begins this year on December 2, we emphasize the joy that some would compare to the months before a child is born: excitement, wonder, joy, expectation, even exhilaration at the life that is in

our midst right now, yet also a hope and longing, and a carefulness to get things into order.

During the Christmas season we celebrate the wonder of the Incarnation. How wondrously we are made that the Word of God would become one of us! God shows us how to live fully: by pouring out our lives for others. That is what the days of Christmas are all about.

Epiphany and the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord celebrate Christ becoming manifest—that is, present—to all peoples. On Epiphany we focus on the three Wise Men symbolizing the many races for whom Christ was born. The baptism of Jesus marks the beginning of his public ministry. God's "Christmas gift" of the Incarnation is a gift for everyone!

This is what the celebration of Christmastime is all about. This is what it means to be a catholic Christian. This year, get in touch with the true meaning of the Christmas season.

On behalf of the Executive Board of the Council, I want to wish everyone and their families a glorious Christmas season. Take back our heritage, our faith, forget the sales, forget what is wrong with the church and remember what Christmas is truly about, the birth of our Lord and Savior.

Insurance Q & A

Taken From Supreme Website

Why aren't my dividends paying my premium?

Who is my beneficiary?

Who is my servicing agent?

What is the cash value of my policy?

1. Why aren't my dividends paying my premium?

Dividends are payable on all forms of paid up insurance except policies being kept in force as extended term insurance. There are five dividend options to choose from: Cash, Applied to Payment of Premiums, Accumulate with Interest, Purchase Paid Up Additional Insurance, and Reduce Existing Loans. When the Applied to Payment of Premiums option is chosen, dividend payment will be used to reduce the premium then due, if the dividend is less than the mode premium. Otherwise, the Order will pay as many premium payments as possible and use the remaining amount to purchase Paid-Up Additional insurance. To discuss the dividend option and other details regarding your policy, contact your Knights of Columbus agent today.

2. Who is my beneficiary?

The beneficiary of a policy is determined at the time of purchase by the policyowner. However, it can be changed by the policyowner at any time during the life of the policy. Typically, the spouse is chosen as beneficiary but other beneficiaries include the children, brother, sister, mother or father of the insured. Institutions and charitable organizations can also be named beneficiaries. All beneficiaries are identified in your policy. Contact your Knights of Columbus agent if you have any questions regarding your beneficiary designations.

3. Who is my servicing agent? Always refer to your policy. A copy of the application along with the field agent's business card should be included. In addition, the name and phone number of the servicing general agent for your council appears on your bill. You can also call 1-800-345-KOFC to find the field agent servicing your council.

4. What is the cash value of my policy? While Knights of Columbus cannot give such information over the phone, the policyowner is encouraged to call the Customer Service department toll-free at 1-800-380-9995. With information supplied by the insured, such as name, address, and policy number, Customer Service will be able to answer such requests via a letter.


