

If a child lives with tolerance, he learns to be patient.



We need to direct more attention to providing exciting social events that will attract many new people along with our loyal supporters. Now how do we begin this process:

As the new election council officers take their seats at the chairs, we need to begin involving the membership of the council in the planning of events. Many of our members have great ideas, many of them have shared those ideas with me. We need to begin to move forward with some of these ideas. As I write this article I have in mind several things that I would like to see the council and the new officers direct their attention to.

3. Continue to do what we do best. Our fund raising programs are excellent. We need to offer more events and get more of the brothers involved. Food Drives, Helping the Elderly, Knight At the Races, Expanding our Youth base by encouraging youth-filled activities.

4. We need to dedicate ourselves to providing a base for future membership by involving more young people in the council. Those young members need to get involved in the administration of the council. I encourage you, to consider running for positions on the council board. Try being a Guard, get involved in a committee, sponsor a program or event. With that in mind, we need to begin the process of establishing a Squires Chapter for our council and re-activating the Columbiettes.

5. Our meetings need to offer more than just a straight business format. We need to consider providing special informal meetings, prayer meetings, social meetings for the purpose of recruiting new people.

6. Programs that involve the council and its auxilliary units, ie Squires, Columbiettes and the Christopher Columbus Corporation

7. Finally, the council needs to consider the possibility of having its own building in order to help spur on council growth. It is almost a guarantee that having our own building for our meetings and social events will bring alot of the membership back to the council setting.

The Key to Success:Keeping Members Interested

How often does it happen that a man joins the Knights, attends one or two meetings, and then disappears?

The key to success in any council is keeping members interested, excited and active. One way you can do this is by encouraging members to participate fully in council activities. Keeping members interested and active in the council starts with the recruiting process. The new member's proposer should accompany his prospect to the Admission Committee meeting, to the First Degree and at the very least to the first several meetings. The proposer must make sure that the new member is introduced to the officers and members of the council and that he is made to feel welcome and not ignored. The Admission Committee process is very important too. The committee should determine where the prospects interests lie. Is he attracted to youth work, to community activities, Church activities, social events? His particular area of interest must be communicated to the appropriate program chairman.

There are many other ways to show continuing interest in new and established members alike, including:

Telephone members and remind them of meetings.

Offer to provide transportation to members who would like to attend council functions, but don't have the means to get there.

Answer questions. Members will ask why council activities are done in a certain way and if things can be changed. Provide them with sufficient information.

Inquire about the particular interests of the members through member interest surveys. Help new members make new friends in the council by introducing them to all fellow

Knights. Friendship is a great strength in any organization.

Be aware of personality conflicts and try to avoid them.

Do all you can to help members feel important to the council.

Get members' names in the council's newsletter, both when they join and as they begin to take an active role.

Be sure members' names are always spelled correctly, whether in the membership directory, on a name tag at a meeting or in a news story.

Establishing caring and concerned relationships among council membership will encourage your members to participate in council activities.

By showing interested in new and old members alike, your council will be confirming its commitment to the membership and will increase their willingness to assist in the programs necessary to help the Church and the community.
