COUNCIL 1012 WALKS THE TALK ON CHARITABLE GIVING

AN INTERVIEW
WITH GRAND
KNIGHT DENIS
SULLIVAN

During the 2001/2002 Fraternal Year, Westbury Council volunteered over 1,500 hours of service and made donations of money and food to an array of programs and activities to benefit the Church, the community, families and youth. Internationally, state and local units of the organization volunteered 58.9 million hours of service to such programs and contributed \$125 million to charitable and benevolent causes.

"We are proud of our achievements as we have attempted to strengthen our Church, our community, and come to the aid of those less fortunate," said Grand Knight Sullivan. "We are very proud of the four major food drives we initiated for St. Brigid's and Our Lady of Hope's Parish Outreach. Food collected was used to assist those in need in the Westbury and Carle Place communities."

"We are also extremely proud of the ongoing scholarship fund we created to provide financial assistance to students from St. Brigid's/Our Lady of Hope Regional School for the furthering of their Catholic education. Each graduating eighth grade student had the opportunity to compete in an essay contest, without consideration of financial need or scholastic aptitude. The subject of the essay was their understanding of the Knights of Columbus, and the student's activities within the student's church or community, or within service groups hospitals or libraries. All essays were reviewed by a panel of judges and the best essay written by a male student and the best written by a female student were selected. Each winner received \$500."

"Still, we know we can do better and to do that, we must grow in this new millennium. That is why we continue to have major membership recruitment efforts. The theme is 'Celebrate—Faith, Family, Fraternity' in Westbury and Carle Place," Grand Knight Sullivan said. "We are inviting every eligible Catholic man in St. Brigid's and Our Lady of Hope Parishes to 'Celebrate—Faith, Family, Fraternity' by joining the Knights of Columbus and sharing the benefits of membership in the Order with his family."

The committee wants to stress to all the council members that for this event to succeed, all members and their families should plan on attending. In addition, many other notables from councils throughout the county, state and Supreme will be invited as well as local politicians and church leaders of the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

KNIGHTLINES IN ACTION By Chester Barkan, Chancellor

In a recent edition of Knightline, the Newsletter for K of C leaders, it was stressed that the Knights of Columbus must be leaders in the church, and society. Supreme Knight Carl Anderson stated "that there is no lay organization in the Catholic Church better suited to leading an authentic, grass roots renewal of the church than the Knights of Columbus. Anderson further stated:

"Through our programs to promote and enhance family life, to support vocations to the priesthood and religious life, to show solidarity with our bishops and priests, and to advance the new front on the path of authentic renewal".

The Knights continue to demonstrate their abilities to be leaders in the Catholic Church and Society. Over \$124 millions have been donated and over 58.9 million hours of service have been volunteered. Several yearend highs were also spotlighted by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson at the Annual Supreme Council Meeting.

- 1. Membership as of June 30, 2002, stood at 1,647,771 up from 1,638,068 in 2001.
- 2. There were 12,079 councils as of June 30, up from 11,860 a year ago.
- 3. Insurance in force as of early June was \$44 billion.
- 4. The Knights of Columbus is rated A++, Superior by the A.M. Best C0. and AAA. Extremely strong by Standard and Poor.
 - 5. Assets at year end were \$9.2 billion.

Concluding his address Supreme Knight Carl Anderson stated "our work has only just begun"...
