



SUPREME KNIGHT SAYS ORDER WILL FIGHT 'FOR AS LONG AS IT TAKES'

The U.S. Senate vote July 14 on the proposed Federal Marriage Amendment (FMA) "shows that the crucial effort to protect the institution of marriage in America will be a long and difficult one," Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson said. "But the Knights of Columbus, in solidarity with the Catholic bishops of the United States, will fight for as long as it takes in order to ensure that marriage, defined as the union of a man and a woman, is protected in law."

Anderson said that "this courtroom battle is another Roe v. Wade in the making. Advocates of same-sex marriage are determined to get the courts to impose same-sex marriage by judicial fiat, and only a federal constitutional amendment can prevent it. Amending the constitution is something that we should never take lightly, and there's no doubt that if this could be settled at the state level, we'd all prefer it. But the recent same-sex marriage decision from the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court has set in motion a process that is all but certain to conclude with a federal court adopting their reasoning and ending traditional marriage forever. As the largest Catholic family organization in the nation, we cannot stand by and

Discover the Bible

"I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you, and make your name great." Gen 12:2

Abram had already lived much of his life. He no longer possessed the vigor of youth or the gullibility and hearty desire for fortune and fame that often characterizes young adulthood. He had earned a secure life in his Mesopotamian culture. But in the middle of life, after his father had died, Abraham received the call to begin again.

God's words to Abram, "Go forth" (verse 1), present an imperative and an invitation. The enormity of what God asks and of the decision to be made is expressed through the threefold listing of what Abram must leave: "your country and your kindred and your father's house." The terms are arranged in ascending order according to the severity of the sacrifice involved: the region of Mesopotamia, his ethnic group, and his extended family. He must transfer his orientation from his homeland and his lineage to God and God's promises.

At the center of Abram's call are the wondrous promises of God. These promises are the key to the entire Bible and will be fulfilled throughout the history of salvation. The initial set of promises express God's commitment to Abram: first, to make of him a great nation; second, to bless him with abundant flocks and numerous offspring, good health and long life; and third, to make his name great so that he will be esteemed with a noble reputation (verse 2). The second set of promises show how God will affect other nations through Abram and how God will protect Abram among the nations (verse 3). Most amazingly, God proclaims the highest goal of Abram's calling: "In you all the families of the earth shall be blessed." Through Abraham and

his descendants, God will bestow universal blessings to all the people of the earth.

For Reflection: When have I overcome the fear of change in order to make a new beginning? In what way is Abraham a model for me of trusting in the future? What is the legacy I want to leave beyond my own lifetime?

Prayer starter: Lord God, you called Abraham to leave his familiar homeland in order to begin again. Help me to trust in your promises to me and overcome the fear of change. Give me the grace to make a fresh start and the wisdom to hope in the future.

WHEREAS, during our Nation's darkest times and in its longest hours, the United States' flag has flown signifying this country's dedication to perseverance, its unshakable unity, and its commitment to preserving an orderly, democratic society for its populace; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we urge our elected representatives to support the passage of Senate Joint Resolution 4 which calls for a constitutional amendment that reads: "The Congress shall have the power to prohibit the physical desecration of the flag of the United States."


